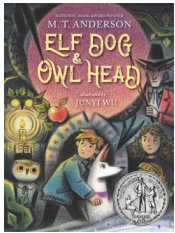

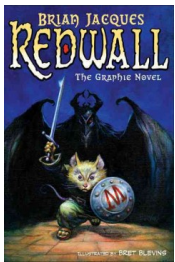


The Story of Gumluck the Wizard

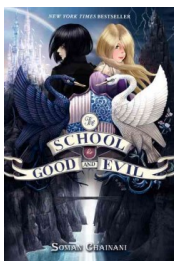


Redwall : the Graphic Novel

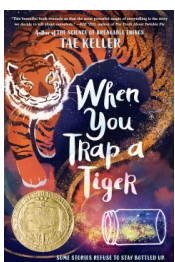
The School for Good and Evil

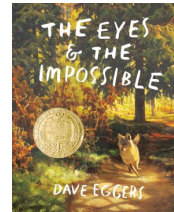


When You Trap a Tiger

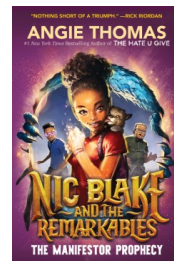
Things in the Basement

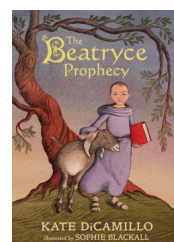


The Ogress and the Orphans

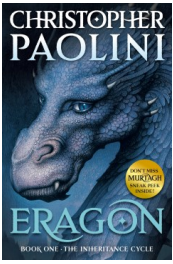
The Beatryce Prophecy

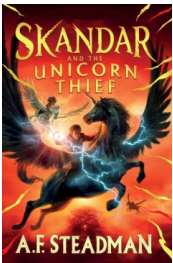


Eragon

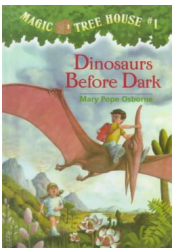


Skandar and the Unicorn Thief

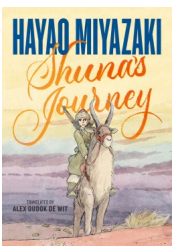


Dinosaurs Before Dark

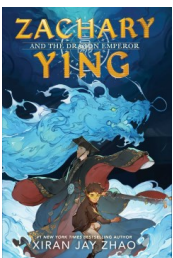


Shuna's Journey

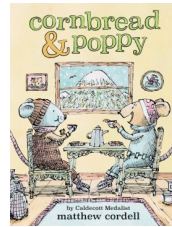


Zachary Ying and the Dragon Emperor

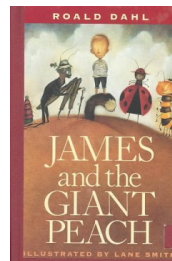

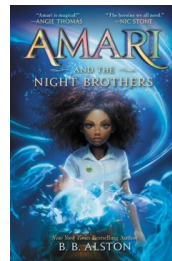
