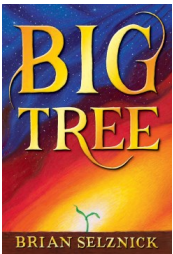


The Wild Robot

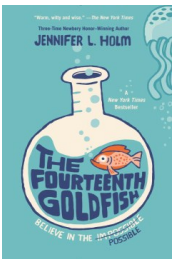


Big Tree

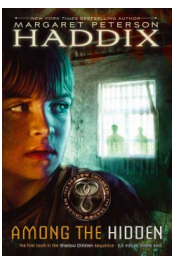


The Fourteenth Goldfish

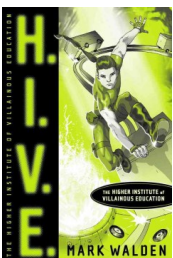


Among the Hidden

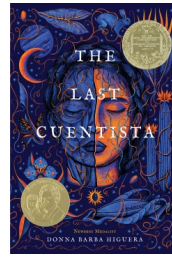
H.I.V.E. : Higher-Institute-of-Villainous-Education

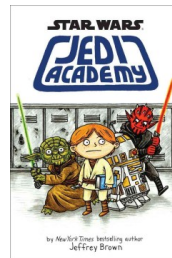
The Last Cuentista

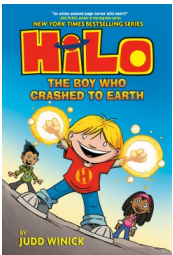


The True Meaning of Smekday

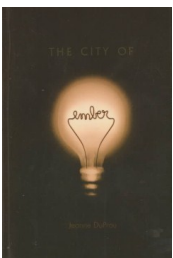

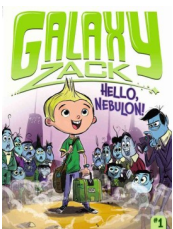


The City of Ember

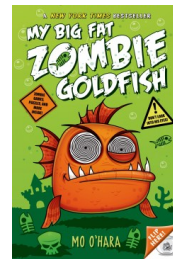
