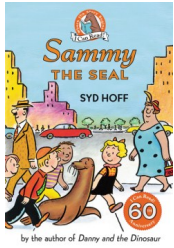

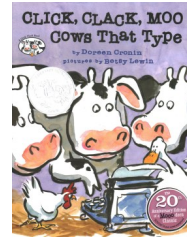


Sammy the Seal

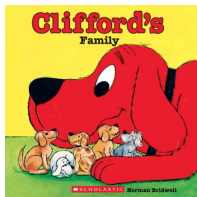


Click, Clack, Moo : Cows that Type

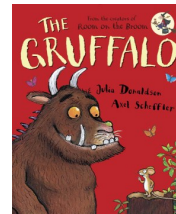


Clifford's Family

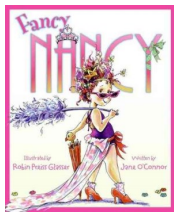


The Gruffalo

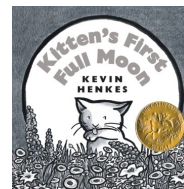


Fancy Nancy

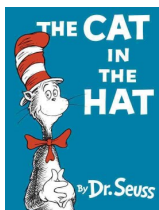


Kitten's First Full Moon

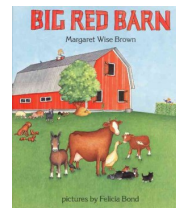


The Cat in the Hat

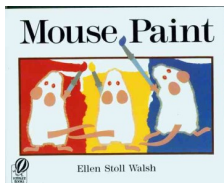


Big Red Barn

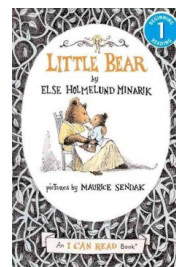


Mouse Paint

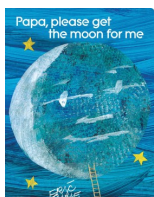


Little Bear

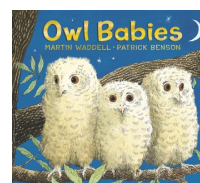


Papa, Please Get the Moon for Me

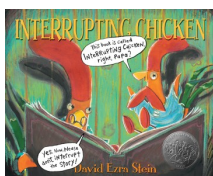


Owl Babies

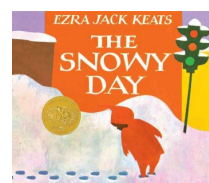


Interrupting Chicken

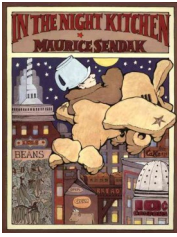
The Snowy Day

A young boy is delighted by first snowfall of the year.

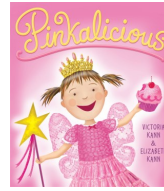

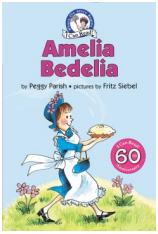
In the Night Kitchen

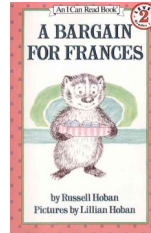
Pinkalicious

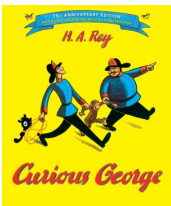
Amelia Bedelia

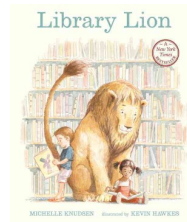
A Bargain for Frances

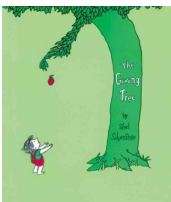
Curious George

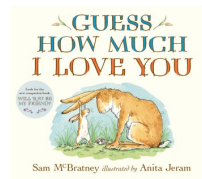
Library Lion

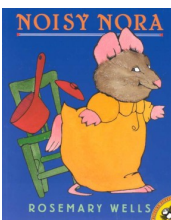
The Giving Tree

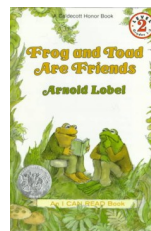
Guess How Much I Love You

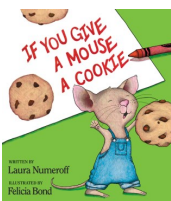
Noisy Nora

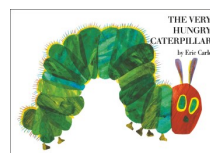
Frog and Toad Are Friends

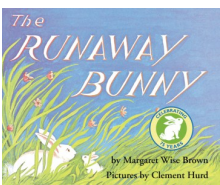
If You Give a Mouse a Cookie

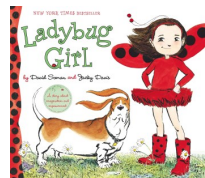
The Very Hungry Caterpillar
