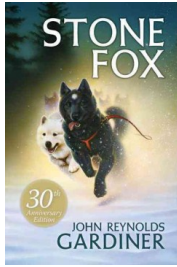

In spite of tremendous odds, a ten-year-old boy and his dog are determined to win a dogsled race and the five-hundred-dollar prize.

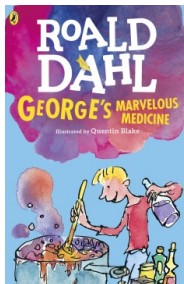

After a bulletin board falls on Stanley while he is sleeping, he finds that being flat has its advantages.

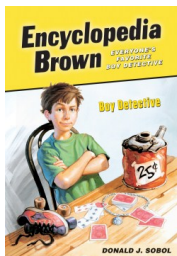

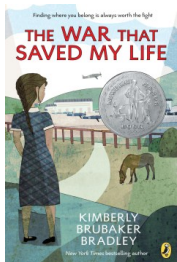

Fifth-grader "Encyclopedia" Leroy Brown solves ten mysteries and, by putting the solutions at the back of the book, challenges the reader to do the same.

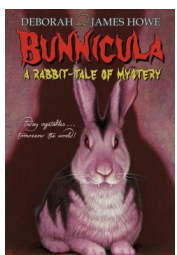

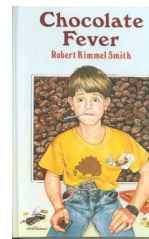


Escape from Mr. Lemoncello's Library

in order to escape.

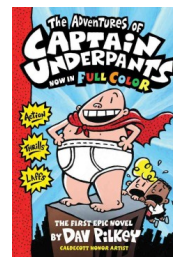

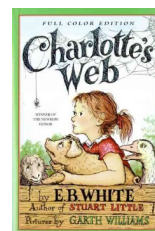

Dan and Amy Cahill are given the choice of receiving a million dollars or uncovering the 39 clues hidden around the world that will lead to the source of the family's power.

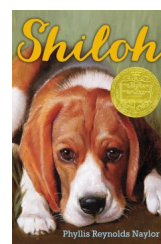

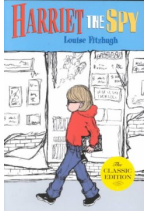


Shiloh

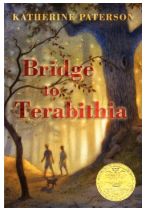


Fablehaven

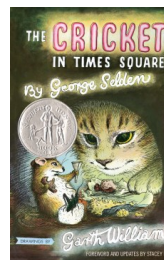


The Tale of Despereaux : Being the Story of a Mouse, a Princess, Some Soup, and a Spool of Thread

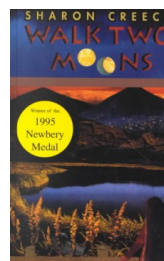

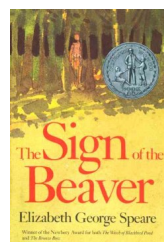


The Lightning Thief
