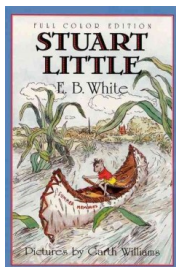

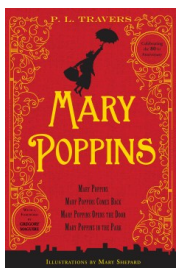


A Little Princess

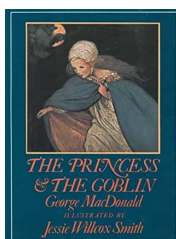


Mary Poppins

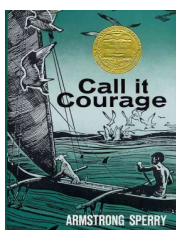


The Princess and the Goblin

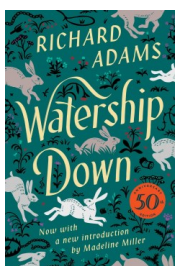


Call it Courage

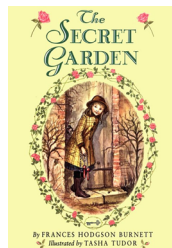


Watership Down

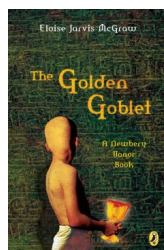


The Secret Garden

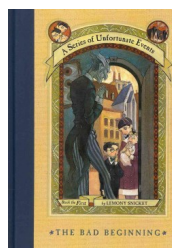


The Golden Goblet

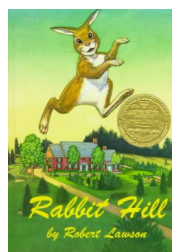


The Bad Beginning

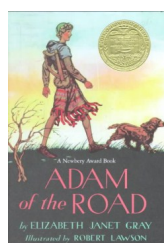


Rabbit Hill

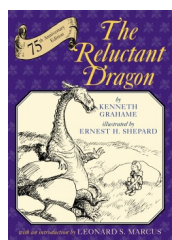


Adam of the Road

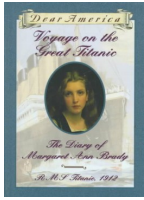
The Reluctant Dragon

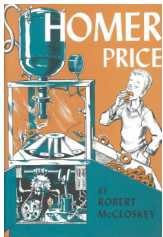
Voyage on the Great Titanic : The Diary of Margaret Ann Brady

American woman, sails on the Titanic, and experiences its sinking.

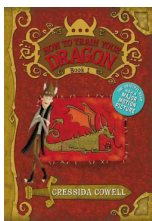

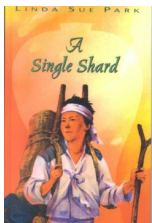


How to Train Your Dragon

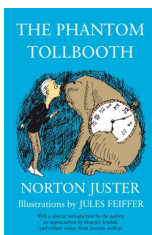


A Single Shard

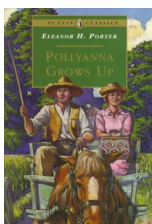


The Phantom Tollbooth

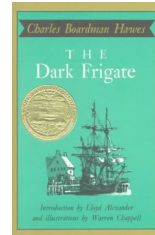


Pollyanna Grows Up

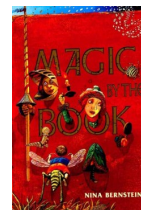


The Twenty-One Balloons

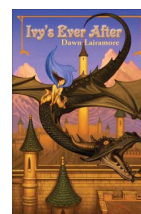
